As the investment and export promotion agency of Timor-Leste, TradelInvest TL liaises between Ministries on behalf of investors; identifies, promotes, facilitates and manages investment and export opportunities; negotiates Special Investment Agreements and issues Benefit Declarations; and monitors and supports investment projects.



Private Investment Law

The Government of Timor-Leste approved the new Private Investment Law No. 15/2017. TradelInvest TL provides advice, consultation and expertise in implementing the law. The new law has been socialized and explained to stakeholders via meetings and workshops hosted by TradelInvest TL.

The Government Decree No. 2/2018 has been issued specifying the process for TradelInvest TL to implement the investment regulations and procedures in the Private Investment Law.



Potential Export Commodities Study

TradelInvest TL recognizes the importance of research to further understanding of Timor-Leste's agricultural capacity and identify commodities and supply chains suitable for development and ultimately export.

TradelInvest TL asked the National Centre for Scientific Research UNTL to conduct a series of baseline studies. The first study identifies livestock and agricultural products grown in RAEOA, Covalima and Baucau. TradelInvest TL hosted a socialization workshop with 80 participants to discuss the findings of the first report. For a summary of the report:
